Unit overview:

This exciting and informative Burns in Critical Care Elective Unit will enable you to develop the underpinning knowledge and skills required to manage the complexities of the critically ill burn injured individual

Unit content:

The curriculum covers all aspects of paediatric and adult burn injury critical care including

- Transfer and acceptance of Burn Critical Care patients
- Managing burn shock and fluid resuscitation
- Assessment and management of inhalation injury
- Advanced respiratory management techniques
- Signs and symptoms of sepsis/SIRS in the critically ill burn patient
- Family support for critically ill burn patients
- Functional positioning and passive movement in burn critical care patients
- ...and much more

The Burns in Critical Care Elective Unit can be accessed by way of accredited academic study or as an informal means to learn more about burn management through attendance only participation.

What does it involve?

Academic Study

Participating in an interactive programme of study that combines e-learning, face to face taught sessions, self directed study, practical demonstrations, debates, discussions, placement/practice learning and completing summative assessments.

Attendance only

Participating in all of the above except placement/practice learning and no requirements to submit summative assessments.

Where and when?

Taught study sessions will take place at either University Hospital of South Manchester NHS Foundation Trust or Central Manchester University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust.

This unit will run for 10 weeks with 7 taught study sessions which take place on Thursdays.

What qualifications/entry requirements do I need?

Level 6 study

Have a minimum of DipHE in a health related subject (Level 5).

Level 7 study

Have a minimum of a Degree in a health related subject (Level 6) for Level 7 study.

Attendance Only

None required

How much will it cost?

Cost depends upon whether you fall into the Northern Burn Care Operational Delivery Network (NBCODN) or not and whether you want to access the content as academic study or as attendance only:

Inside NBCODN

Free academic study £150 attendance only

Outside NBCODN £700 academic study

£700 academic study £300 attendance only

What qualification will I get?

Academic study of this module affords 20 credits.

A Certificate in Professional Studies (Burns Care) at level 6 or a Post Graduate Certificate (Burns Care) at level 7 or is awarded on the completion of the Core Unit and one Elective Unit.

Each unit can also be accessed as a stand alone unit.
