Core Unit

Unit overview:

This original and informative core unit will provide the foundation of key burn injury knowledge and burn management principles from which to facilitate current best practice in burn care.

Unit content:

The curriculum covers all aspects of both paediatric and adult acute burn injury management including

- Burn Aetiology
- Calculation of Depth and Total Body surface Area
- Management of acute and procedural pain
- Management of Chemical and Electrical burn injuries
- Surgical intervention procedures and early excision
- Physiotherapy/Occupational therapy for the burned patient and early rehabilitation measures
- Wound healing and appropriate dressing selection
- Psychological difficulties experienced by burn patients and practical solutions
- ...and much more

The Principles and Practice of Burns Care Core Unit can be accessed by way of accredited academic study or as an informal means to learn more about burn management through attendance only participation.

What does it involve?

Academic Study

Participating in an interactive programme of study that combines e-learning, face to face taught sessions, self directed study, practical demonstrations, debates, discussions, verbal and poster presentations, placement/practice learning and completing summative assessments.

Attendance only

Participating in all of the above except placement/practice learning and no requirements to submit summative assessments.

Where and when?

Taught study sessions will take place at either University Hospital of South Manchester NHS Foundation Trust or Central Manchester University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust.

This unit will run for 20 weeks with 14 taught study sessions which take place on Thursdays.

What qualifications/entry requirements do I need?

Level 6 study

Have a minimum of DipHE in a health related subject (Level 5).

Level 7 study

Have a minimum of a Degree in a health related subject (Level 6) for Level 7 study.

Attendance Only

None required

How much will it cost?

Cost depends upon whether you fall into the Northern Burn Care Operational Delivery Network (NBCODN) or not and whether you want to access the content as academic study or as attendance only:

Inside NBCODN	Free academic study £150 attendance only

Outside NBCODN	£1400 academic study £300 attendance only

What qualification will I get?

Academic study of this module affords 40 credits.

A Certificate in Professional Studies (Burns Care) at level 6 or a Post Graduate Certificate (Burns Care) at level 7 is awarded on the completion of the Core Unit and one Elective Unit.

Each unit can also be accessed as a stand alone unit.
